Mayor Borchik began the Board Meeting with Pledge of Allegiance at 7:00

Jessica Barrow - Community Garden

Jessica spoke about the community garden, they've had a couple events so far and a few more in the works. All the plants have been donated, the children sold hostas to raise money for picnic tables. They have work days, second Saturday every month from 10-12 the community can come, they've started a garden committee/club. They are trying to make it a safe place for people to come, learn, and also looking to have classes on canning and basic learning how to cook. They're currently trying to raise money for a shed.

Mayor and Trustee Comments

Mayor Borchik updated the board on the north side of the Village there's five water users with the Town that had a water leak issue, last week the Town Board approved that Barton & Loguidice do a map plan and report for those users, the proposal will become part of Oswego River Road extension. Regarding our sewer treatment plant, you've received a detailed summary, they met with Barton & Loguidice, they provided a map with the lines that need repair immediately and it should satisfy the consent order, a new line will run down Rt. 264 which will also provide hookups to the sewer. They are still looking for grants to cover additional costs. Attorney Schiano has started a conversation for a new municipal agreement. B&L have secured a 30 year loan at 0% interest through EFC for the amount that the Village will owe, it's estimated at \$34 a year to the residents.

NY Forward there's several businesses in the village that have been in contact and are already in the process with NY Forward, 15 Culvert, Duskees, Connexcare, Lock 1, the daycare with the Walts property and also 73 State Street.

Lock 1 Distillery will be doing a lot of community events starting with a farmers market starting June 2nd, every Monday through September. Update on the Bridgehouse, the DPW is building 10 new picnic tables for the park, we're looking for some additional chairs, we're excited for the Bridgehouse program and hope they will do well this year with Kathy Lathrop at the lead. The bronze statue of Cathy Lee looks like it'll be ready for the fireworks.

Mayor and Jim Lynch had a meeting with Jeff Brown, Executive Director of OCWA, the hookup rate that we pay each year is set up by Onondaga County, Onondaga County residents pay in their taxes and

also pay a quarterly water bill as well. The 6% increase should not happen again next year. Oswego County is looking at the idea of forming their own water authority and potentially a well for the county, their looking at a couple areas, Great Bear is one of them and their looking at ways they can help.

Trustee McBurnie if anyone would like to volunteer at the grill for the VFW field days.

Trustee Maxam had nothing.

Trustee Koegel said it was good to see a police officer walking the streets.

Trustee Hartner said he dropped off a new brick order for out front of the Sweet Building.

Department Comments

Chief Ferazzoli handed out April 15-May 20 police activity report. Chief has 14 traffic posts to cover for the Memorial Day Parade, 11 officers and 6 volunteers from the criminal justice school in Syracuse, parking signs and barricades will be placed. The DG Market active investigation, we have two suspects, both under the age of 18, the parents have to be involved, we'll have their statements and it can be closed. Currently we have three officers interested in working here.
