Message from the Mayor



The Village of Phoenix has recently awarded the construction contract for the Booster Pump Station on County Route 12. The project which was publicly bid according to State Health Department approved plans and specifications has been awarded to Grant Street Construction which is located in Cortland, New York. Accommodations have been made in order to secure specialty equipment to complete the installation of the connection to the Metropolitan Water Board Water Source. Site activity could possibly be initiated this fall/winter; however, a substantial portion of the specialty work and equipment will be pre-manufactured off site and delivered to the site in the spring. Connection to the new water source is scheduled for mid- late spring of 2017.

To help facilitate the next step to provide the highest quality of water possible the Village is conducting a water survey. The survey will cover a variety of questions relating to the water quality. When filling out the survey please answer each question based on a yearly average. We all have experienced low quality water throughout the year due to flushing, water main breaks and large unexpected uses. Please disregard these times when answer each question. Please do not park overnight on the streets so snowplows can get down streets and clean them efficiently. When plowing or snow blowing driveways and sidewalks do not put snow in the road which may cause hazards for other drivers. After the holidays the DPW will be collecting Christmas trees daily or between cleaning up snow events. Please make sure Christmas trees are placed on the edge of the road and not in the roadways. If you would like to drop off your trees to the DPW there will be an area at the DPW to put them. Please call the Clerk's office to get details. If you have portable basketball hoops out make sure they are off the edge of the road so the plows will not hit them. We do ask if you have a fire hydrant next to your property to please try to keep clear in case of an emergency. I hope everyone has a safe and happy holiday season!

From the Code Enforcement Office

Winter is here so please remember to keep your Village Sidewalks clear. Aside from being a Village Law, many of our residents of all ages and our mail carriers and delivery people use these daily. Let's try to keep it safe and enjoyable for all!

For your convenience, the entire Code for the Village of Phoenix is now on line for your review. Remember to check with the Village about obtaining a building permit prior to doing any type of home or property renovations or project.

It is dark out early and house numbers can be difficult to see at this time of the year. Please remember that the New York State building code requires residents to provide emergency vehicles with house numbers that are at least 4 inches in height on the front of every residence. Numbers shall contrast with their background. Please make sure that your house numbers are clearly visible.

And as a friendly reminder, all trash cans are to be kept behind your home or under shelter and trash can be put out no earlier than 12:00pm Wednesday before Thursday pick up. All trash receptacles are to be removed from the curb before the following Friday morning.

Water Main Breaks

If you notice a ground swell or an unusually large flow of water coming from underground, it is likely a water main break. The freeze thaw cycle that occurs in a typical Winter season puts pressure on the underground water system. A typical break takes 4-6 hours to repair depending on weather conditions, conflicts and delays in locating surrounding utilities in the repair area. Repair crews shut off water to those served by the broken main and try to give notice to homes and businesses via our Village website and social media notifications unless it is late at night.

After the repair is completed and water is restored, the affected homes and businesses might experience some discolored water resulting from the mineral sediment stirred up during the repair. Run the water for 5-10 minutes until the water color returns to normal. To report a water main break during normal business hours from 7:30am until 4:30pm, phone the Village office at (315)695-2484 or after hours, dial 9-1-1.



Did you notice a street light out?



To report a street light out, flickering or in a hazardous condition, please contact the Village Clerk's Office at (315) 695-2484. We will need to know the address of the property that the light is directly in front of or the pole number.


