Message from the Mayor

The Village has completed a great milestone "A New Source of Water." The Village made the connection on September 12, 2017 to OCWA. Since the connection our water operator has reported a significant drop in chlorine used throughout the system. This confirms that the water the Village is receiving is of a higher quality of water with fewer particles than the previous source. I personally have observed a decrease in particulates using a home test kit. The Village office and Oswego County Health department has received numerous phone calls expressing the improvement in water

Now that the Village has a new source of water the next step will be identifying areas within the system that might need to be replaced to continue improving water quality and delivery. To help facilitate identifying areas of concern I will be sending the questionnaire, once again, to compare previous observations. The Village will use this information to develop a comprehensive plan to replace our current infrastructure.

The Village board understands the importance of delivering the highest quality of water possible while being respectful about the cost associated with the water. Throughout this project the Village applied for and received a few grants and loans which helped keep the increase low. The Village is also buying water from OCWA which added to the infrastructure cost by \$2.00 per 1,000 gallons. The new minimum water charge will be \$72.10 for 8,000 gallons.

D.P.W. News

The Village DPW has been working on multiple projects this year. They have been busy with work in the downtown area with the dock at Henley Park and installing a sound system in the Park and Business area. They also have been working with contractors and the Village Engineer on getting the new water pump station up and running smoothly. Currently we are working on projects at our Waste Water Treatment plant and sidewalk replacements from our sidewalk program. If anyone is interested in having the DPW replace their sidewalk through this program please call the clerk's office to ask how this is done. We also have been out through the Village collecting yard waste and brush every week and doing

maintenance on streets and Village properties. We are looking forward to getting a few more sidewalks done and work at the Waste Water plant completed before the winter months are upon us.

The Village DPW is setting up a pick-up time for loose leaves to be picked up with the leaf vacuum this October. This will not interfere with the pick-up of bagged leaves and yard waste. Loose leaves can be placed along the curb, not in the road, and especially not on or near storm basins. Please keep them off the blacktop so rain does not wash them down the road. We will split the Village into two areas and each area will receive two pick up days. Only loose leaves can and will be picked with the leaf collector. Any other time after these pick up dates your leaves will not be picked up loose with the vacuum, they will need to be bagged in paper bags to be picked up. Leaves must be placed out prior to the day of pick-up. Unfortunately we will not have the extra time to back track or rerun the routes. The times of pick-up will be:

October 9th and 23rd - All properties south of Lock Street, Not including Lock Street.

October 16th and 30th - All properties North of Lock Street, **Including** Lock Street and the Heights area.

- ♣ All paper bagged yard waste will be picked up as usual.
- ♣ Brush pick up will end Friday October 27th, as we prepare for the winter season.


